



# Support the German Farmers' National Demonstrations to Defend Food Production!

## Farmers Are on the Front Lines for Humanity!

*Aug. 16—The following statement was issued this month, to crossfire international support, after farm and ranch leaders from four countries met on the crisis.*

We stand together with the German farmers in their protest demonstrations in August. They are on the front lines, alongside the Dutch farmers, in protesting to stop the dictates that will shut down farms, and cause mass food shortages, ordered by their governments, and by the European Union in Brussels.

Dutch farmers face mandates to cut livestock by as much as 30%. The excuse for this is to reduce emissions and run-off of nitrous oxide and ammonia. German farmers face mandates to drastically cut use of fertilizer, pesticides and cropland itself. Similar mandates are coming down in the Americas, and other targeted agriculture regions. The year 2030, and earlier are the deadlines.

The originators of these deadly mandates operate through an international constellation of globally powerful, private banks, NGOs, transnational corporations, and captive government offices. They must be stopped. They know full well their directives mean depopulation.

We must expand, not cut, food production. We have a world food shortage emergency. Over 800 million people go hungry, and millions of them are headed to death by

starvation. These numbers could double in a year. The world grains harvest is going down.

Our support for the German and Dutch farmers is a call to action among our fellow citizens, in whichever country we may be, to restore national sovereignty, and stop the destructive dictates and the trans-national finance and cartel powers behind them.

We need sovereign government action, and collaboration among nations, to expand independent food producers everywhere, and mobilize emergency and long-term measures to vastly increase food production. Double it! We need mutual-interest trade and foreign relations, and cancellation of economic sanctions. Use anti-trust to bust up the monopolies. Re-regulate banking on the Glass-Steagall principle. Build infrastructure (water, power, public health, transport) to protect from drought, floods, and all disasters.

Food is not a "farmer's issue." We call on people from all walks of life to join with us, in supporting the farmers everywhere.

## German Farmer Activist: Peaceful Revolution Will Come!

Aug. 26, 2022 (EIRNS)—In a 4-minute video message, German farmer activist Alf Schmidt (one of the speakers at the BueSo national party convention six weeks ago) reveals that the national farmers rally, originally planned for Berlin today, has been called off because organizers for it had been "massively threatened."

The Green system which the farmers are justifiedly opposed to, because it puts an end to Germany as a country with modern efficient agriculture, aims to replace it with a country with only half of the animal farming and grain growing, which will import food from abroad, taking away the food from other countries.

The EU plans, implemented also by the German Agriculture Minister Cem Ozdemir (Green Party), foresee taking 35 percent of arable lands out of production completely, the remaining lands at 70 percent permitted to

reduce industrial fertilizers and pesticides to an extent that half of the grain that still is grown today, cannot be grown any longer. The other 30 percent of permitted arable lands are reserved for inefficient bio-farming. In terms of output, 60 million tons of grain will not be produced under such conditions, Schmidt charged.

Standard food items have seen a level of price inflation which, Schmidt reported from a talk with a supermarket saleswoman, has created a dramatic situation which sees people no longer stealing alcohol and cigarettes, but food items instead. Diesel prices have doubled in the past months, fertilizer producers have stopped operation because the natural gas which is required to produce is not there, and other scandalous things. But "a peaceful revolution is to come—must come," Schmidt declared at the close of his video.
