



The Nations of the West Must Cooperate with the New World Economic Order!

September 6, 2025—*The following statement has been released by the Schiller Institute for immediate circulation internationally. It was written as a rallying call during this period of change and tumult, and individuals are encouraged to endorse it.*

At the summit of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) in Tianjin—representing around 42 percent of the world's population—a new world order has emerged, independent of the West, founded on the principles of sovereignty, non-interference, mutually-beneficial economic cooperation, and peaceful collaboration. It is an event of global historical significance that China and India—the two most populous nations, already representing 35 percent of the world's population—have now begun to cooperate closely with each other and with Russia. The countries gathered at the SCO, along with the various interconnected organizations such as the BRICS, the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), the Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU), ASEAN, CELAC, and the African Union (AU), collectively represent 85 percent of humanity.

The emergence of this new world order is a response to the collective West's attempt, after the end of the Cold War, to establish a unipolar world under Anglo-American dominance—marked by endless interventionist wars, sanctions, and regime-change efforts—which has ultimately

backfired completely. The nations of the Global Majority are now overcoming an era of 500 years of colonialism and asserting their right to independent economic development. This is made possible above all by China's unprecedented rise, which offers countries of the Global South a model and the cooperation that the West denied them for centuries.

Thus, the world has reached an absolute turning point. We can either continue the geopolitical confrontation against Russia and China, risking a third—and this time final—world war, or we can choose to cooperate with this emerging new economic system. President Xi Jinping has proposed the vision of a "Community with a Shared Future for Mankind," which he emphasized in his Sept. 3 speech commemorating the 80th anniversary of Japan's defeat: "Humanity will either sink together, or rise together!"

It is in the fundamental self-interest of the nations of the Collective West—no longer truly united—to cooperate with the states of the Global Majority and to jointly address the great challenges facing humankind: overcoming poverty and underdevelopment, ensuring lasting world peace, and securing the right of every person on this planet to fulfill their potential.

Take Concrete Action Toward a New Era: Stop the Genocide!

The world is entering a new era of civilization following the extraordinary decisions made at the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) summit and the profound moves toward a paradigm of Peace through Economic Development. These changes give the people of the world a precious opportunity to respond to create a New Just Security and Development Architecture, so that every human life is treated with dignity and respect.

In this global context, Professor Jeffrey Sachs in a September 6 Consortium News article outlined concrete actions for leaders, organizations and representatives to intervene to end the Genocide. These demands are summarized below:

1. End all economic trade, shipping and air links with Israel as done recently by Türkiye.
2. All UN member states that have not yet done so should recognize the State of Palestine.
3. Arab signatories to the Abraham Accords, Bahrain, Morocco, Sudan, and the U.A.E., should suspend their diplomatic relations with Israel until the Gaza siege ends and the State of Palestine is admitted to the UN.
4. Suspend Israel from the UN General Assembly, as done in the case of the South African Apartheid Regime.
5. UN member states should stop the export of all technology services that support the war (Amazon, Microsoft) until the siege of Gaza ends and Palestine's membership in the UN is adopted by the UN Security Council.
6. Under UN General Assembly Resolution 377 (V), "Uniting for Peace," a UN Protection Force should be sent to Gaza and the West Bank. Writes Sachs, "Typically, it would be the UN Security Council that mandates a protection force, but in this case, the U.S. will block the Security Council with its veto. There is another way."

In addition to the above, there must be a plan for reconstruction of the entire region which will require abundant amounts of energy and fresh water. Lyndon LaRouche's 1975 Oasis Plan would be a good model, and will become a real possibility if the West can abandon its destructive short-sighted quest for global hegemony and cooperate with the Global Majority as proposed in the Schiller Institute Appeal on the other side of this leaflet.

We encourage all organizations, leaders and representatives to follow these immediate actions. Please join the international chorus to create an era where we can have true peace and prosperity for all human life.
